

Getting Your Bearings

Here's what to know before heading out on the road, trail, or river.

PRIVATE PROPERTY

Morgan Valley boasts the highest percentage of privately owned land in Utah. This includes ranches and family farms dedicated to livestock and sheep farming, and field crops.

To respect these vital agricultural spaces, visitors are not permitted on private property at any time. Some families and local outfitters facilitate outdoor experiences such as horse-drawn wagon rides (page 15) and snowshoeing (page 26) on these private lands. For hiking, trail running, and cross-country skiing, stick to approved public routes at state and local parks.

WEATHER

We get four distinct seasons, for lots of activities! Our summers are warm and mild with cooler evenings. The snowiest days in the Valley typically span December through February.



DRIVING AROUND

Morgan Valley is full of curves and mountain driving and sometimes, unexpected weather. Make your visit a safe one by following posted speed limits, wearing a seatbelt, and staying alert. Four-wheel drive is best for navigating the Valley's snowy and icy conditions.

HANDLING ALTITUDE

With altitudes ranging from 5,200' in Morgan to max elevation of 7,420' at Big Mountain Pass, Morgan Valley is considered high altitude. Visitors occasionally feel the effects of this change.

If you're visiting for the first time or coming from lower elevations:

Stay hydrated: Carry more water than you think, especially for outdoor adventures.

Pace yourself on the trail and at the gym: Ease into your activity and adjust as needed. The reduced oxygen levels can make you feel more winded.

Stop while you're ahead: If you're feeling nauseous, tired, dizzy, or have a sudden headache, listen to your body and get to a lower altitude right away.



SUMMER

The Weber River stays warmer than most in Utah, making it the perfect spot for rafting. Or go golfing, boating, swimming, or try other watersports.



The trail stretches four miles from Mormon Flat Campground to the top of Big Mountain located on Highway 65. Check out historic sites along the route on page 40-42.

HOGSBACK SUMMIT "HEARTBREAK RIDGE"

The Mormon Pioneer Trail, Pony Express National Historic Trail, and California National Historic Trail all cross at this divide. Its name comes from the unmistakable despair of the emigrants who upon reaching this spot, saw the jagged peaks and rough terrain of the Wasatch Mountains on the horizon. CANYON CREEK

SOUTH ROUND VALLEY SCHOOL BUILDING

DEVIL'S LOOKING GLASS

DEVIL'S SLIDE

Northeast

Made of Twin Creek Limestone, these unique formations took shape approximately 165 million years ago. That's 10 million years before the age of dinosaurs! Round out the Devil's Toys by visiting Devil's Looking Glass and Devil's Gate.

DEVIL'S GATE

Northwest

Spot this geological passageway right at the county line - just west of the Weber Canyon I-84 Eastbound Rest Area.

THOUSAND MILE TREE

Northeast

Witness railroad history. Located along the Union Pacific Railroad's Overland Route in Weber Canyon, this sturdy pine marks exactly 1,000 miles from Omaha, Nebraska, the origin point of the Transcontinental Railroad.




